

Ozone Advance Guidance Updates

2016 Spring CenSARA Membership Meeting April 13, 2016

Background

- The Advance Program is a collaborative effort by EPA with states, tribes, and local governments to encourage emission reductions in attainment areas, to help them continue to meet the NAAQS for ozone and/or PM_{2.5}.
- Currently, 42 areas located in 23 states/9 EPA Regions are participating.
- Participants are implementing plans that typically include a combination of:
 - Voluntary, mandatory, and awareness-building efforts.
 - Mobile and stationary source, energy, education, green infrastructure, and wood smoke programs.



Revised Ozone Advance Guidance

- Ozone Advance began in April 2012, PM Advance began in February 2013.
- Ozone Advance was initially focused on maintenance of the 2008 ozone standard; updates to reflect the 2015 standard were needed.
- Several other updates and clarifications were warranted, along with one substantive change.
- Our partners recently completed their review of the document (a webinar was held last month to discuss), and the new version will be posted next week.



Change to Eligibility Criteria

Enable areas that are still designated nonattainment for a revoked ozone NAAQS to join Ozone Advance if they are not designated nonattainment for subsequent, non-revoked ozone NAAQS.



Updates and Clarifications

- Updated the guidance to focus the program on maintenance of the new 2015 ozone NAAQS.
- Reiterated that Marginal areas can continue to participate if they
 join the program prior to their designation, and would drop out
 if/when they are reclassified to a higher classification.
- Emphasized the Clean Air Act distinction between initial designations under a <u>new or revised</u> standard vs. redesignations under an <u>existing</u> standard.
- Provided more examples of information that areas should consider including, beyond the necessary list of measures/programs and schedule.
